Errata:

Page 3, Savage 99 Dates – Westfield, MA : Some early 1971 rifles had a Y date stamp, but later rifles in 1971 do not have a date stamp. The Y date stamp is not listed for 1971 on page 3 but can show up.

Page 3, Savage 99 Dates - Westfield, MA : The 75th Anniversary's high serial number is 8300AS.

Page 14 : First 1899 (Serial Number 10.000) was finished in October, 1898.

Page 43, 1899H : Catalogued as available with only the special options of sights, checkering & engraving. But a few pistol grip 1899H's do exist.

Page 47, Crescent Grade : The entire receiver is NOT matted. The sides of the receiver inside the engraving area is stippled.

Page 70, Savage 99G : Style 2 should say front sight base changed from integral base to ramp base.

Page 81, Savage 99EG : Serial number range start should be 346,000 at top of page and for Style 1.

Page 82, Savage 99EG : Style 2 should also list the 30-30 for 1939-1940

Page 82, Savage 99EG : Style 3 serial number range should be 750,501 – 783,235 (1954-1956)

Page 83, Savage 99T : Footnote ending with “1945” runs into page number “83”.

Page 94, Savage 99F (Version 2) : Style 4 99F's from 1960/early 1961 may have fluted combs.

Page 104, Savage 99PE : It has cut, hand checkering rather than pressed, skip line checkering.

Page 105, Savage 99E/S : Ending serial number range should be B256620.

Page 108, Savage 99CD : First year 99CD's in 1975 did not have a medallion.

Page 108, Savage 99CD : There is a Style 2 99CD in 1980 with pressed checkering.

Page 111, Savage 99CE : Has a gold plated trigger, not blued trigger.

Page 117, Appendix B : Correct spelling of Siegfried Rentzke's last name is “Rentzschke”.
